Statewide Assistive Technology Programs (ATP's)

<u>ATP's</u> are federally funded programs in almost every U.S. state which offer:

- Information about what devices and services are available and where to get them
- Device loan and demonstration, and in some states, borrowing programs to 'try out' devices
- Funding resources for buying or getting assistive technology
- Device exchange and recycling programs that provide individuals with used equipment at little to no cost

Statewide Alternative Financing Program

<u>(AFPs)</u> are programs in almost every U.S. state which can help individuals living with a disability get affordable financial loans to buy assistive technology.

- Typical assistive technology bought through this funding include:
 - Modified vehicles
 - Home modifications
 - Vision/hearing aids
 - Adapted computers
