Nonprofit Assistance for Disease-Modifying Therapies

There are several organizations that assist with the cost of Disease Modifying Therapies for people with MS. Because these organizations are nonprofits, their assistance will count as out of pocket costs for Part D drugs (oral or injectable therapies), helping beneficiaries reach catastrophic coverage for all of their medications.

For medications covered by Part B (administered in a healthcare setting, such as infusions), these organizations may assist with the coinsurance. Individuals should always inquire about a wait list if these organizations indicate they are out of funds.

Pharmaceutical Assistance for MS Therapies including Symptom Management Treatments

Each of the MS disease-modifying therapies and symptom management treatments has a pharmaceutical assistance program. Some will help Medicare beneficiaries find solutions to high Part D costs, others cannot. We encourage individuals to call the pharmaceutical company if help cannot be found through other subsidies or organizations.
